Applications will be available online from 12 noon on 9th January 2024 until 12 noon on 26th January 2024.

PRIMARY SCHOOL APPLICATIONS

For our current pupils moving on to the next stage in their education please follow the same procedures and timeline for applications as outlined above. Please note also that Primary 1 Admissions Criteria for all schools will be available on the EA website from 12th December 2023 to help you make the correct choice for your child.

Autumn Walk

The children have been observing and talking about Autumn. We would love the opportunity to take the children on an Autumn Walk to Brooke Park during the month of November to explore signs of Autumn and have a play in our local park.

For us to be able to carry this out safely for child/adult ratio we would need parent volunteers to help support us to make this possible We would welcome any volunteers so please let your class teacher know if you are available to help.

Date will be confirmed closer to the time and a full risk assessment will be carried out by the staff prior to the visit. Please ensure that the children come to school dressed in appropriate clothing and footwear.

Permission has already been sought from parents at the start of the year but please let your class teacher know if you have any concerns or wish to withdraw your consent.

Parent Teacher Meetings

Parent Teacher Meetings will be taking place during the month of November.

A sign up sheet with date and time slots will be posted outside each classroom in due course.

This is a settling in meeting to discuss your child's progress and, an opportunity to voice any concerns.

If you are unable to attend in person, we are happy to arrange a telephone call.



Curriculum

During the month of November we will be looking at the theme of night and day.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development.

- To discuss our own safety in darker autumnal evenings e.g. wearing reflective clothing;
- To discuss the importance of sleep;
- To explore fears of the dark through discussion and stories e.g. Owl Babies, Can't you Sleep Little Bear;
- To develop an awareness of personal hygiene routines in the morning and evening;
- To discuss the importance of breakfast.

Language Development

- Opportunities to listen to stories related to the theme in small and large groups as well as at individual book browsing;
- Opportunities to learn songs and rhymes related to the theme Wee Willie Winkie, Activity Songs such as I get up In The Morning (Sticky Kids), Sleeping Bunnies;
- To introduce information books related to theme;
- To learn new vocabulary related to the theme night and day, moon , stars, bedtime, late, early, morning;
- To recall past experiences of night and day;
- Opportunities to read bedtime stories to our friends;

Mathematical Development

- To learn early language related to time;
- To develop an awareness of the pattern of our day e.g. getting up in morning, bedtime routine, meals;
- To sort and match pyjamas by colour and pattern, top and bottom;
- To explore day and night shapes e.g. circle, crescent moon, star;
- To sort objects by night and day.

Curriculum (contd)

The World Around Us

- To plant our winter bulbs and discuss how they need to be kept in the dark to start to grow;
- To discuss clothes that help us to be seen in the dark;
- To discuss nocturnal animals and sounds;
- To develop an awareness of safety with regard to darkening nights;
- To discuss different occupations that involve day and night shifts e.g. nurse, fireman.

The Arts

- Opportunity to dress up/take on roles with regard to bedtime;
- To choose appropriate clothing for dolls day time and night time and opportunity to develop imaginary scenarios;
- To explore the different rooms in the house;
- To explore the theme through art/craft activities e.g. fireworks, light and dark paper;
- Opportunity to explore light and dark colours.

Physical Development

- To develop large motor and fine manipulative skills through dressing and undressing bedtime clothes at house area;
- To develop physical skills e.g. movement, spatial awareness through the use of action songs related to theme;
- To develop fine manipulative skills by dressing and undressing dolls in autumnal clothes;
- To continue developing cutting skills and extend to cutting around circular shape for more experienced child.

3+ Review

If your child is in his/her final preschool year and moving to Primary one next September you will be offered the opportunity to have a 3+ Review.

Pre-school education settings recognise that parents/carers are the child's first and continuing educators, who provide a wealth of information about each child on entry to pre-school.

Our school's Health Visitor, Ami Leonard, parents and staff in the pre-school settings, will carry out the 3+ Review. The review will help to assess children's overall development at this key stage, and also identify any developmental needs, facilitate early provision of support where required or onward referral if needed, and assist the pre-school in planning.

The 3+ Review is usually carried out in 2 stages:

- 1. completion of a questionnaire by the child's parent/carer which you will have received already;
- 2. meeting between the health visitor and the parents/carers in the preschool setting to discuss the child's development, including the information provided in the completed questionnaire.

Ami and her colleague will be carrying out the reviews on 27th & 28th November 2023. They will take place in the school. Please return your form if you have not already done so and please consult the sheet on the Multi Purpose Room window to make your appointment, should you wish to be here with your child during the review.

World Nursery Rhyme Week 13th—17th November
